3) Superintendent Report

Supt. Hurt

- WNKY featured a nice segment on our Judy Thompson with our Youth Services Center. She was highlighted as a Hidden Hero.
- WNKY also featured a segment on Brody Hurt as an Emerging Leader at Metcalfe County High School.
- This is FRYSC week. We are thankful for the staff we have at our schools. Mrs. Judy Thompson and Mrs. Patty Bunch are with us here tonight.
- It's also School Counseling Week. We are thankful for our school counselors, including our new mental health counselors. We've heard nothing but good things since we began the program.
- We had some successful NTI days.
- COVID numbers seem to be going back down. We have been able to stay in-person more than many other districts. We have just used five NTI days all year long. Last week, for a couple of days, we had no double bus routes for the first time since school started.
- KHSAA realigned the 4th Region at its last meeting. It will affect volleyball, girls and boys basketball, baseball, and softball. We stay where we are in the 16th District but add Monroe County. We will be a five-team district starting next year. Warren East moves to the 15th, Foundation Christian is added to the 14th. "I spent a good deal of time working against it but was unsuccessful."
- Bus driver Ken Childers' wife passed away after a long battle with cancer.
- Action item 5A is Mrs. Judy and Mrs. Patty with FRYSC.

- Action item 5B, we are keeping the student insurance the same.
- Action item 5C is Donna with the financial report.
- Action 5D, we have the 2022-2023 district calendar up for your approval. Mr. Trotter can answer those questions.

Allen Trotter

- Calendar Committee met a couple of times, and a 2022-2023 district calendar is ready for approval. In order to fulfill the requirements for a literacy grant, we built in two teacher workdays, one in the fall and one in the spring. No students would be in school those days. It's a 167-day calendar. The first day for kids is August 29. The last day is May 26. Fall Break is the first week of October, and Spring Break is the first week of April.
- We have a Facility Planning Committee meeting on Thursday night. We will be updating progress on plans for a new bus garage. This will be two of at least four meetings. During meeting three (after the meeting on Thursday), the architect will present her work. Engineers have been here doing surveys.

Tim Brown: Is the location still the same?

Mr. Trotter: It is. It is near the greenhouses behind the high school.

Mr. Hurt: That's not finalized yet, though. That's where the engineers and we are looking at.

- Thanked the board for its support to FRYSC over the years. We are here tonight to ask for the assurance that the district will keep supporting the FRYSC program until 2024. This will come without a budget. The budget won't be ready until the legislative session is over.

Mr. Hurt: What they're asking for tonight is your (the board's) assurance that we will continue the FRYSC program as we have. There are no changes. It renews us through 2024. Also, right now, the house budget looks favorable to education in general which includes FRYSC and transportation. We are looking forward to having a good budget for the next couple of years.
