3) Superintendent Report

Superintendent Josh Hurt

- Our prayers are with the Parke family. Josh Parke was killed in a logging accident last week. His two children attend MCMS and MCHS. Josh and his wife Maria were involved in various school organizations.
- In the consent items, Jamie Howard has announced her retirement. We thank her for her many years of service, and we will miss her. There will be more details to come later.
- Board members were shown a video featuring COW time (Creative Opportunities Wednesday) at MCEs. The video is airing on SCRTC channel 95, the Hornet News Network, and the district's website.
- 2019 MCHS graduate Shawn Edwards has been accepted into Auburn University's Veterinary School after graduating from Murray State in 3 years.
- MCHS senior John Linkous has been accepted into the University of Kentucky Honors Program.
- Dylan Fields was a first-place winner in the Skills USA regional competition.
- Congratulations to the Lady Hornets on winning the district basketball tournament and advancing to the semifinals of the regional tournament.
- In a meeting with GRREC on March 2, Mr. Hurt was asked to participate in the ad hoc strategic planning committee. Mr. Hurt was also asked to help the next cohort of new superintendents. He was one of two selected from his cohort of about 20

superintendents. GRREC also asked Mr. Hurt to be a representative at the AEPA (Association of Educational Purchasing Agencies) Conference in April in Orlando.

- March 16-18 Mr. Hurt and others will attend the Law Institute in Lexington. It's a training hosted by KASA.
- The legislative session continues. The budget has yet to be decided. Commissioner Glass provided an update today.
- 5A on the agenda, Allen Trotter or Matt Shirley may talk about that. The bleachers are done. We are asking you tonight to wrap that up and for approval to complete the project from a paperwork standpoint.
- 5B on the agenda, Torrie Osbon will talk more about this. She went to a school public relations conference recently that focused on branding. We are conserving putting up some signs or a billboard to get some messaging out about the options and opportunities at Metcalfe County Schools.
- 5C on the agenda is also Torrie. We have agreed to accept the Math Achievement Fund grant, and part of that is being able to hire a math coach at Metcalfe County Elementary School. The math coach would not teach but would work with teachers to improve math among students at the elementary school. This person would be on a 185-day contract and certified scale just like any other certified employee. Approximately \$15,000 from their salary would be paid for through the grant.
- Donna has agenda item 5D.
- 5E on the agenda is a request from the Barren County Family YMCA to help fund their pool repair project, which is \$197,000. Metcalfe and other surrounding districts used their pool free of charge for swimming lessons for many, many years. We would like to contribute \$2,500 to the project.


